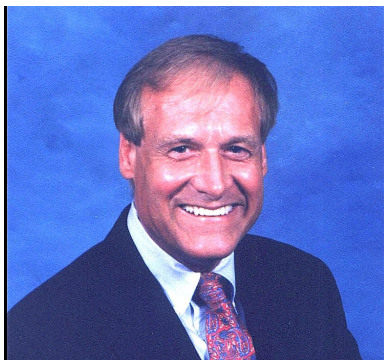

Rick Robol ([Independent Ohio](#)) joined 300 attendees at the meeting of the Bipartisan Policy Committee ("BPC") at Ohio State University on Tuesday, October 15, 2013. The two Co-Chairmen of the [Presidential Commission on Election Administration](#) (PCEA), Robert Bauer and Benjamin Ginsberg were on the first panel of the event, and as Rick noted, their focus was on the interests of the Republican and Democratic parties. "There was little mention of independent voters as Bauer and Ginsberg discussed the work of the Commission, stating that its focus was on administrative issues." Robol asked the next panel to address issues of independent voters and after some prodding, the panel had a very engaged discussion about the value of open primaries and the circumstances of independent voters. IndependentVoting.org's national independent reform committee which orchestrated our campaign to

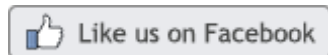
